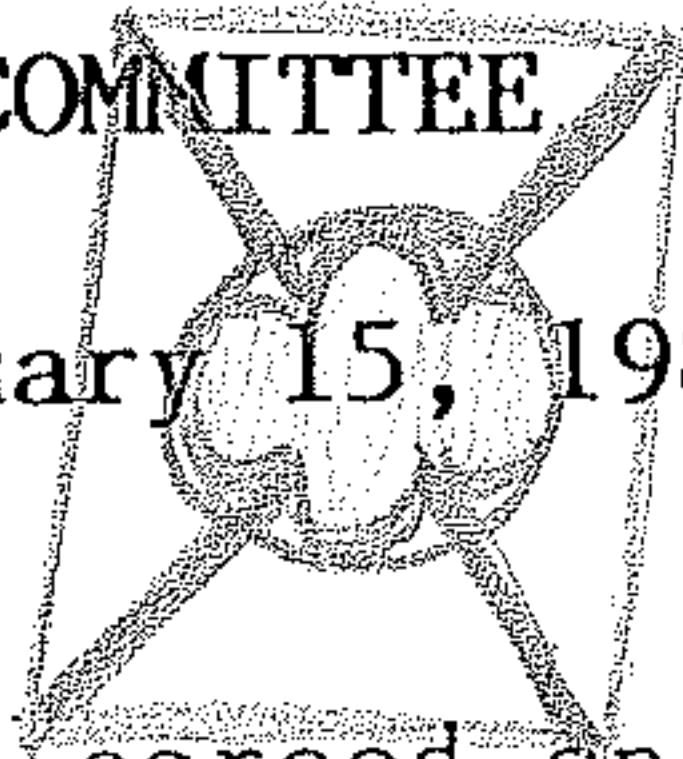


REPORT OF THE ORGAN COMMITTEE

TO THE FACULTY — January 15, 1987 —



1. — The Committee has agreed on the following specifications for the new chapel pipe organ:

- aa. Placement: center of rear of chapel; loss of two complete pews, and half of two more pews. Console to be built "into" the organ case
- bb. Action: tracker (mechanical)
- cc. Size: 20 ranks (sets of pipes) 16 voices (stops) on three divisions
